Big Brown adds star power to New York stallion roster for 2015

THE PILE OF LETTERS, many fans' phone calls, and media requests from the likes of the Wall Street Journal asking to visit the farm near Pine Plains, N.Y., serve as reminder for Dutchess Views Farm that Big Brown carries a level of fame rarely seen in a New York-based stallion.

Big Brown is the first Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner to stand in the Empire State since 1979 winner Spectacular Bid moved to New York's Milfer Stud in 1990, where he stood through 2003, after initially standing nine years at Claiborne Farm in Kentucky. Big Brown also began his stud career in Kentucky at Three Chimneys Farm

near Midway, where he stood from 2009 through last season.

While Big Brown will add star power to New York, returning Empire State stallions include a champion male sprinter in Trinniberg, his sire Teuflesberg, and the state's 2014 leading sire and perennial success story Freud. Those stallions helped register a record season last year (with numbers still coming in) as they accounted for at least 1,487 foals at total advertised stallion fees of \$8.9 million, both New York records for the 21st century.

Becky Thomas of Sequel Stallions New York said the success of the New York-bred program has helped shape the

state's currently strong stallion roster.

"Now that the program is on the incline again, it's really made people stop and take a look," Thomas said. "When you look at the money associated with the program-you're not going to have every Kentucky breeder-but you do have a large number of people who look at the program and utilize it in a lot of different

Noting the success New York-breds enjoyed on the track in 2014, with horses such as Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr.

IT) winner and champion turf female Dayatthespa, New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive director Jeffrey Cannizzo said he's seen similar improvement in the quality of New York-based stallions in recent years.

"The stallion landscape here is evolving in the right direction, and it's going hand in hand with our breeding industry," Cannizzo said. "It's the chicken and the egg. Do stallions come here because of the good mares or do the good mares come because of the good stallions? I'm a believer that it's kind of hand in hand which is why we've seen this steady progression in our foal crop.

"We've seen our stallion roster improve based on quality. At the end of the day, you look at what's happening on the racing scene and that's in line with this move to quality as well."

Big Brown was moved to Michael Lischin and Anya Sheckley's Dutchess Views this year after Sunrise Stallions' Andrew Cohen and Gary Tolchin's Golden Goose Enterprises purchased a majority interest in the two-time classic winner last year. They were among the owners of Big Brown during his racing career.

As 10-year-old Big Brown begins his seventh season at stud, his connections certainly deserve credit for timing. Besides interest in Big Brown for his on-track accomplishments that included victories in the Derby and the Preakness Stakes (gr. I) to earn champion 3-year-old honors of 2008, the son of Boundary-Mien, by Nureyev, also has one of the top colts on this year's Triple Crown trail in Dortmund.

Out of the Tale of the Cat mare Our Josephine, Dortmund closed out a perfect 2014 campaign with a victory in the Los

Alamitos Futurity (gr. I). Dortmund was listed fourth on Steve Haskin's initial Derby Dozen in *The Blood-Horse*.

Lischin said that breeders often wait longer to commit to stallions in New York, but Big Brown was bucking that trend with 45 mares already committed. Lischin credited the buzz around Dortmund as helping to increase interest in Big Brown, who stands for \$8,500.

"People have noticed over the years that if you have the stallion of a horse making big news, like Dortmund for Big Brown, there's a dramatic difference in the number of people who will come to look at the horse," Lischin said, adding that he expects all breeders looking at New York stallions to give Big Brown a long look. "He certainly is a horse that everyone will consider, and then depending on their price range and mare, would pick."

Lischin said there is excitement from both breeders and the general public.

"There's been a lot of excitement," he

said. "The day after the horse arrived, the Wall Street Journal was up here with a photographer and a writer, and they did a really nice article. That's the first time the Journal has ever been out here," Lischin said. "There's definitely more interest than any other horse we've ever had in the 18 years we've been here. This is just another level of excitement. This is a famous, well-known horse in New York."

While curiosity and headline power can't hurt, the success Big Brown's progeny enjoyed last year will go a long way toward securing him mares this season. Big Brown boasted 11 stakes winners in 2014 including three graded/group stakes winners.

"It's been very good for Big Brown," Lischin said. "He fits here well in New York."

The lucrative racing program both for New York-breds and for horses by New York sires has helped increase interest in the state's stallions. To participate in the New York-bred program, resident mares are free to visit stallions in any state as long as they return within 90 days of their final cover. Non-resident mares can participate in the program if they foal in New York, stay in the state for at least 90 days

after foaling, and are bred back to a New York-based stallion.

With that type program, Cannizzo said, quality stallions are

"It's highly important; otherwise, it doesn't necessarily work here," Cannizzo said. "When people bring mares here to foal, the reality is that many of them are non-resident mares. They need to stay and be bred to New York stallions. When people are breeding commercially or for specific reasons, they're going to look to have stallions that fit their own program. If you don't have the right stallion pool to do that, they're not going to be bringing their mares here.

"It's highly important to have the right stallions, a roster that's continually improving and continually fresh, that offers all of the bloodlines and pedigrees the breeders are interested in from a commercial standpoint and to race."

Progeny of nominated New York-based stallions are eligible to race in the lucrative New York Stallion Series, which includes 10 races with total purses of \$1.1 million. Under a policy that started last year, all foals by stallions that are nominated to the series are automatically eligible—without a nomination fee—for all New York Stallion Stakes series races.

Breeders of New York-sired New York-breds are eligible for extra bonuses in the New York State Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund program that in 2014 paid out \$12.8 million. While a New York-bred receives an award of 15% of purse money earned when winning a New York race (7.5% for second or third), those percentages double to 30%-15% when the New York-bred is also New York-sired.

Stallion owners also are eligible for bonus awards of 10% of top-three finishes. In 2014 a

total of \$3,031,327 was paid out with Sequel leading the way at \$700,607. In 2014, 86 stallion owners collected from the fund. averaging a record \$35,248 a payment.

While Big Brown looks to gain a foothold in New York, Freud is back for his 14th year at stud in New York. Freud finished as New York's leading sire last year, paced by New York-bred grade III winner Lubash, a turf runner who secured the seventh and eighth stakes wins of his career in 2014. Along with grade I winner Frost Giant, who stands at Keane Stud Operations, Freud carries the state's highest stud fee of \$10,000 at Becky Thomas and Dennis Narlinger's Sequel Stallions New York.

With grade I winners such as Giant Ryan and Franny Freud, Freud has built up the quality of broodmares through his own success. Last year Freud led all other sires with 11 individual winners and 12 races won at the Saratoga Race Course meeting.

"The quality of his mares has certainly picked up, which is defi-

nitely related to his success," Thomas said. "For Freud to have made it with those level of mares, it's a phenomenal feat."

Freud has shuttled to Argentina, which has opened the door to some additional quality mares. That led to Freud picking up the third top-level winner of his career last season when Alex Rossi won the Polla de Potrillos Roberto Alvarez Calderon Rey (Peruvian Two Thousand Guineas, Per-I).

Big Brown and Freud aren't the only New York stallions who had grade I winners last year as Congaree is back for a sixth New York season and his second at Saratoga Stud, where he stands for \$7,500. Last year Congaree's runners were led by Kentucky-bred Don't Tell Sophia, who won the Juddmonte Spinster Stakes (gr. I) at Keeneland and finished second in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I) at Santa Anita Park.

Congaree had three total stakes winners last year, including 2015 Monrovia Stakes (gr. IIT) winner Shrinking Violet.

Thomas had closed up shop in New York for a couple of years before returning for the 2012 breeding season at Sequel Stallions New York. She said a partnership with Darley convinced her the timing was right to return. In that first year Sequel Stallions New York stood Darley's Girolamo, a grade I-winning sprinter by A.P. Indy.

Thomas said a horse such as Girolamo previously would not have started his career in New York, but the relationship with Darley allowed him to start there. Girolamo, whose first foals are 2-year-olds this season, moved to Darley Kentucky last year.

Under the agreement with Darley, Sequel is standing Desert Party, a grade II-winning son of Street Cry who stood his first three seasons in Kentucky before arriving in New York in 2013. Sequel also is standing 2012 Travers Stakes (gr. I) and 2013 Woodward Stakes (gr. I) winner Alpha, a son of Bernardini who is standing his first season for \$8,500. Thomas said stallions with that kind of potential are catching breeders' eyes.

"We had to have a stallion that people outside the state of New York perceived as a stallion they wanted to go to," Thomas said. "That's how the relationship with Darley evolved. Prior to that, if these types of horses ended up in New York, it was because they failed elsewhere. But to start off in New York-that was another thing."

This year's New York stallion roster boasts three horses that ranked in the top 65 on the North American sire list in 2014 in Freud, Posse, and Big Brown. After ranking second to Freud on last year's New York sire list, Posse is back for a sixth season. He had eight stakes winners in 2014, and stands for \$5,000 at Rockridge Stud.

The Empire State's top 11 sires in 2014 were represented by 12 grade/group stakes winners, the highest single-season total ever for New York-based stallions. Thirty-one of the 73 New York-bred stakes winners in 2014 were sired by New Yorkbased stallions, including grade II winner Zivo (by True Direction) and graded winners Samraat (by Noble Causeway), Lubash, and Hot Stones (by Bustin Stones).

Besides offering a classic winner in

Big Brown, New York also offers a Breeders' Cup winner in 2012 champion male sprinter Trinniberg. The winner of the 2012 XpressBet Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I) stands for \$7,500 at Rockridge Stud near Hudson where he entered stud last season. New York-bred The Lumber Guy, a grade I winner who finished second to Trinniberg in the 2012 Sprint, is back for his second year at Keane Stud, where he commands \$3,500.

Also in New York is Trinniberg's sire, Teuflesberg, who stands for \$5,000 at Mc-Mahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds.
